LPN to Bachelor of Science in Nursing

This flexible online program is especially developed for LPNs and LVNs who want to earn an associate degree and continue on to earn a bachelor's in nursing. The curriculum begins with a course focused on the competencies and core values inherent in the role of the registered professional nurse, and with the completion of the associate degree component, you're ready to prepare for the NCLEX-RN. The bachelor's component of the program shifts away from individual patient care to population-based health and the role of the RN in influencing health care delivery.

As the final requirement of both the associate degree and bachelor's degree components, you'll demonstrate what you've learned during a capstone course. The capstone for the associate degree emphasizes advanced skills, knowledge, judgment, and professional values, and includes a laboratory and clinical practice experience where you'll care for multiple patients in a health care facility. For the bachelor's degree, the capstone gives you opportunities to collaborate with peers, members of an interprofessional team, and community members and organizations on a practice experience of your choice that improves the quality of health care.
